The town council of the town of Beaver, Arkansas met at 7:30 at the home of Mayor Thomas for the regular monthly meeting.

Mayor Thomas having been sworn in as Mayor by the County Clerk, proceeded to swear in Alderman Durland, Reitz, Rutter, Bengé, Clerk Fitzsimmons and Marshal Sybrandts.

The regular monthly meeting was then called to order: Present Alderman Durland, Reitz, Rutter, Bengé, Clerk Fitzsimmons and Mayor Thomas. Absent: Alderman Baldrige.

Clerk read the minutes of the Public Revenue Sharing Meeting of Dec. 6 1983 and the Public Budget Meeting of Dec. 27, 1983. Then the Minutes of the regular monthly meeting of Dec. 6, 1983 with no corrections or additions they stood as read.

The Mayor read a letter which was sent to the Bureau of the Census concerning Revenue Sharing and a Park Management Plan that was sent to the Corp of Engr.

A third letter drafted by Alderman Reitz to possible park attendants from a list provided by the Corp was accepted by the council by a unanimous vote.

Motion was made by Aldermen Bengé and 2nd by Alderman Rutter that the Clerk pay for the Park Gas @ 1.20 per gal. Vote was unanimous

Motion was made by Alderman Reitz and 2nd by Alderman Durland that Clerk continue membership in the International Institute of Municipal Clerks and pay the \$30. fee. Vote was unanimous.

Motion was made by Alderman Reitz and 2nd Alderman Durland for the Treas to open an account for Revenue Sharing Vote was unanimous.

With no further business the Mayor adjourned

First order of Business: Mayor Thomas explained the contents of the park grant package and the seminar he and Alderman Reitz attended. Due to the complexity of the application the grant will be put aside until the park plans for 1984.

Alderman Reitz gave a report of the response to the letters for a park attendant: The response was not as large as expected and due to the small salary, most responses lost interest. Alderman Reitz asked for a motion to accept the last viable application.

Mayor Thomas received a reply from the Harrison Tractor and Equip. Co. in reference to the John Deer Tractor, enclosing a Warranty with the price of \$2380. plus tax.

Alderman Bengé made motion the council order same tractor for the park.

Alderman Reitz 2nd. Vote was unanimous for.


Mayor Thomas suggested we join the E S Chamber late in March (cost \$25.) He also suggested an Am Flag and an Ark Flag for the park

FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS: THE TOWN OF BEAVER COURT HEARING WAS TAKEN UNDER ADVISEMENT

MR REITZ ON THE PARK : MR BROWN WILL BE HERE AROUND THE 20th OF MARCH TO TAKE OVER THE MANAGEMENT OF THE PARK.

THE ENTRANCE TO THE PARK WILL NEED CEMENT OR GRAVEL TO ROUND OUT THE ROADWAY.

THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF BEAVER ARKANSAS MET AT 7:30 P M AT THE HOME OF MAYOR THOMAS FOR THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING.

THE MAYOR CALLED THE MEETING TO ORDER WITH ROLL CALL:

PRESENT ALDERMAN: RUTTER, REITZ, DURLAND, BALDRIDGE, BENGE CLERK FITZSIMMONS AND MAYOR THOMAS.

CLERK FITZSIMMONS READ THE MINUTES OF THE APRIL MEETING AND WITH NO CORRECTIONS OR ADDITIONS THE MINUTES STOOD AS READ.
